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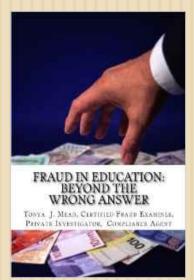

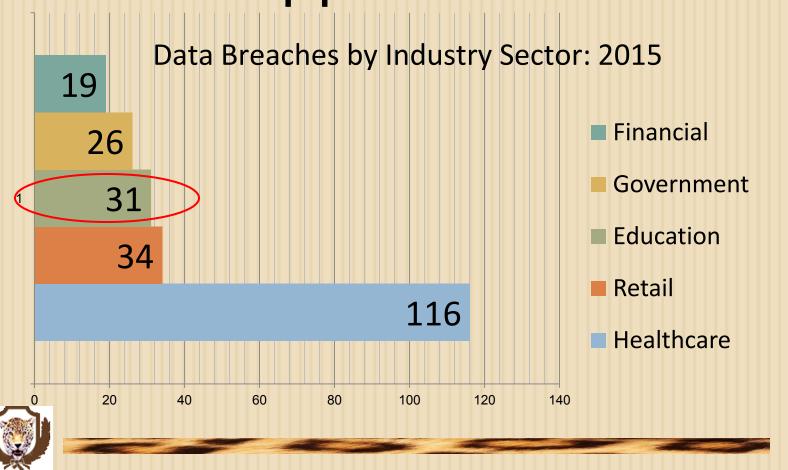


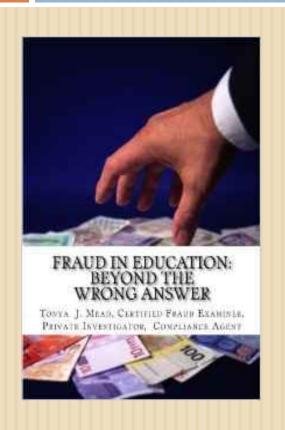
What Happened? Fraud

- 36 convicted terrorists linked to the 9/11 bombings came to the US using student visas
- An alleged terrorist attempted to use \$5,000 in student financial aid to fund his overseas trip in 2015
- \$222 million in overpayments to 42,000 distance learners
- Systemic data manipulation in Atlanta, Detroit, Dade, and Columbus public school systems
- \$203 million in waste and fraud in the charter schools

What is Fraud?

Any intentional act or omission designed to *deceive* others, resulting in the victim suffering a loss and/or the perpetrator *achieving a gain*

- Rationalize 'I am doing nothing wrong'



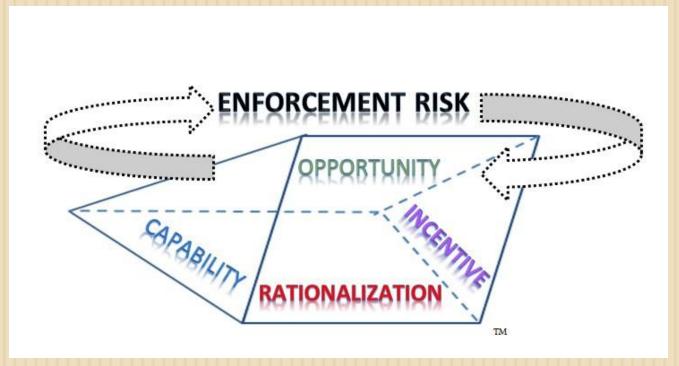

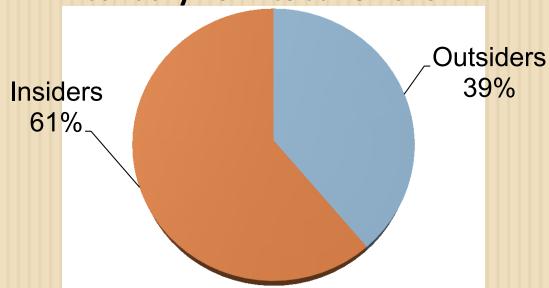
Prosecuted Fraud in Education
